This Lead Teacher Role provides professional leadership and management to secure high-quality teaching, effective use of resources and strengthened curriculum delivery for all students with identified learning needs at SGCS.

The Lead Teacher Student Support will report to the Head of Senior School and will work collaboratively to provide an inclusive educational environment through coordination, oversight and monitoring of students with disabilities or with additional learning needs.

Key Responsibilities include:

- Consulting and communicating with students, parents, teaching staff, school counsellors and external providers

- Developing, implementing and reviewing pedagogical approaches and appropriate adjustments to support the additional needs of students with disabilities or learning difficulties
- Facilitating the appropriate diagnostic assessment of students and using this and other data to determine and develop IPs and IEPs
- Leading the Student Support Team
- Leading the Professional Learning of the Teaching Staff in understanding, planning for, teaching and delivering teaching that meets the needs of students with disabilities and additional learning needs
- Establishing and managing systems for data collection and data analysis and confidential documentation

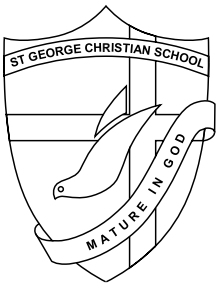
